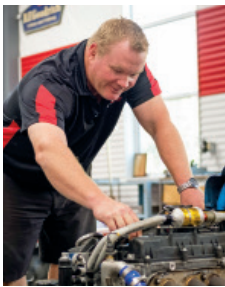

An abbot, a crypt, and a third space



The Rev. Jay Fostner '84 is vice president for mission and student affairs. An assistant professor of psychology, he joined the counseling staff at St. Norbert College in 1997. He was appointed vice president for mission and heritage in 2004, moving into his current role in 2012. The division of mission and student affairs is committed to creating and inspiring a vibrant campus community noted for its rich incorporation of the Catholic, Norbertine and liberal arts traditions; its radical hospitality; and its culture of responsibility and care for one another. Fostner majored in psychology at St. Norbert and went on to earn both his M.A. and Ph.D. from the California School of Professional Psychology. He entered the Norbertine order in 1982 and was ordained to the priesthood in 1988.

One of my favorite things to do is give tours of St. Norbert Abbey. The abbey, which lies about three miles from the college, was dedicated in 1959 after the Norbertines outgrew their original home on campus. If you haven't been there, it's beautiful – quiet, warm, spiritual and inviting. You are most welcome!

The abbey is critically important to almost everything that happens on campus. For that reason, every new student, every new parent, every new faculty and staff member starts their time at St. Norbert College with a tour of the abbey. We hope it helps everyone associated with the college understand the connection between the abbey community and the college community, and how the abbey both supports and gives direction to the college.

During the tour, after looking at the massive and beautiful church and talking a bit about the liturgical prayer life of the Norbertines, I tell visitors it's time to walk down some stairs and tour the crypt. Nearly every time, someone in the group says, "The what?"

We descend the stairs to a sacred place. In the crypt, well-designed display cases hold the vestments that were used during the time of Abbot Bernard Pennings (early- to mid-1900s) and of Abbot Sylvester Killeen (mid-1900s, when the abbey was first dedicated). There is a case displaying vestments still in use today. Also to be found in the crypt are memorial stones set in the floor, marking the sites of three tombs. The center tomb is the final resting place of Pennings – the founder of the Norbertine order in the United States and the founder of St. Norbert College. The tomb to his right holds the remains of Killeen, second abbot. Killeen advanced the order's mission extensively. Among his achievements were the advancement of St. Norbert College to a new level of academic excellence. The third grave is not yet occupied, but is reserved for the next larger-than-life member of the community – maybe even for someone who will one day be deemed a saint.

It is that empty space that often draws the eyes of our visitors. A question is sometimes asked, "Who will go there?" My answer is always the same, "Likely the next Norbertine who does great things to advance the mission of the Norbertine order in De Pere and

the United States." "You?" someone almost always asks with a smirk. "No," I answer. "There is no doubt that I'll be planted in the front-yard cemetery with the rest of my Norbertine brothers."

After the guests leave, I sometimes go back to the crypt and privately ask myself the same question: Who will be the next great figure in our little order? And then I ask another question: Who is already among us doing great things?

President Tom Kunkel often told the story of how, shortly after becoming St. Norbert College's seventh president, he went to the crypt to keep company with Abbot Pennings. Reflecting on the life of this young Dutch priest – a man who came to the United States in the late 1800s, started a school and grew the order with practically no resources at hand, and who laid a foundation that is extremely strong and will only get stronger – this is certainly a great way to gather inspiration. It worked for Tom: He had an extremely successful nine-year run in the president's role.

Now it's the turn of President Brian Bruess to take the helm at St. Norbert College. Brian and I have been friends for many years. We've served on association boards together and we've spent a good amount of time sharing dreams and career goals. There is no doubt that the community at the college and beyond will quickly learn how blessed we are to have Brian as our eighth president. But there is also no doubt that Brian, in his turn, will stand by the vision of our founder, Abbot Pennings, and will look to his legacy for guidance and support.

But maybe what's most important is that Brian, like all of us who are deeply associated with the abbey and the college (and that includes those of you reading this note), will strive to live and minister as someone who might be worthy of that third space. Like St. Norbert himself, like Abbots Pennings and Killeen, like the 30-plus Norbertines worldwide who have already been named blessed or saint, like so many others who hold a special place in our hearts, we are all called by God to live a life of love and compassion. I have no doubt that, as Brian leads the way, the entire St. Norbert community will join him in his journey with grace and certitude, borne on the shoulders of our founder.

Future focus

An endowment allows an institution to exercise good stewardship and helps safeguard its future. An endowment at St. Norbert College can be used for purposes designated by the donor or can be undesignated. The payout rate for an endowed fund is approved by the board of trustees annually. Endowment income can provide for scholarships, faculty positions and operating funds, and for programs like study abroad and undergraduate research. Endowment gifts can also fund ongoing commitments like endowed professorships, coaching positions and building maintenance. Typically, endowment funds are managed prudently to yield more than the targeted return requirement, to include an amount of growth to keep up with inflation. For many colleges and universities, including St. Norbert at this time, the payout amount is approximately 4.5 percent of the endowment's average asset value.



Unprecedented gift funds new possibilities at St. Norbert

The St. Norbert College endowment has received an unprecedented gift honoring the legacy of **Donald J. Schneider '57** in serving the community and advancing Catholic education. Schneider was the president, CEO and chairman of Schneider National; a St. Norbert College student, alumnus, trustee and adjunct instructor; and a person deeply committed to the Catholic faith and values, says **President Brian Bruess '90**.

"We are honored and humbled by the remarkably generous gift from the Donald J. and Patricia A. Schneider family, and our sincere gratitude goes to them for their enduring devotion to helping others throughout our community," says Bruess. "Their gift will help St. Norbert College students for generations to come by providing a rigorous educational experience that engages them in community service and developmental experiences working with local organizations."

For decades, Don and **Pat Schneider** have made possible mission-focused work to advance Catholic education, including at St. Norbert College. Their support enabled the college to establish the Donald J. Schneider School of Business & Economics and a new Master of Business Administration (MBA) program, as well as the new athletics stadium.

"Don and Pat's passion and involvement over the years have been instrumental in making St. Norbert an exemplary, mission-centered college," adds Bruess. 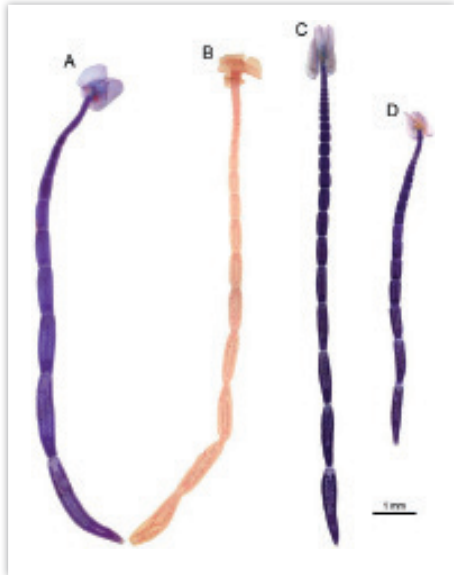


The family name

All in the family



A recently published study identifies two additional species for the *Anindobothrium* genus, and proposes the tapeworms make up the family *Anindobothriidae* in the *Rhinebothriidea* order. The family of tapeworms is named to honor **Anindo Choudhury** (Biology). The study by Bruna Trevisan, Juliana Primon and Fernando Marquez, appeared in the journal PLoS One.

Choudhury shared a lab with Marquez in 1997 at the University of Toronto, where he shared a story about his self-infection [for research purposes!] with the human broad tapeworm. “[I] still had the worms in me when I was in Toronto. I even had stretches of the worms in jars that I had collected,” Choudhury says. “Fernando was quite taken by this and announced that if he ever discovered a new genus of tapeworm, he would name it after me.”

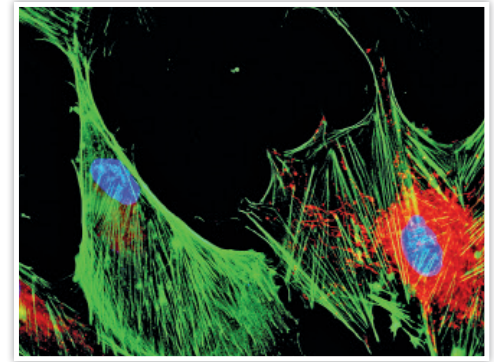
Marquez made good on his promise in 2001, and recently discovered two more species in the genus. Using DNA sequence data, Marquez and his graduate students determined the four species of worms formed their own family.

Crassicutis choudhuryi, a species of fish fluke, is also named for the St. Norbert parasitologist.

A microscopic view

Human fibroblast cells photographed through a research-grade fluorescence microscope were grown by students in Cellular Physiology, a course taught by **Russ Feirer** (Biology).

Students, competing to create the best image, stained the DNA of the cells’ nuclei to turn them blue, and used phalloidin conjugated to a green fluorescent dye to affect the microfilaments. They transfected the cells with a virus that inserts a gene for red fluorescent protein, or RFP, which targets the mitochondria.



Shock waves

Lucy Arendt

(Business Administration) studies decision-making with regards to natural disasters and has been sought out by local and national media – including WIRED magazine, which interviewed her for the article, “The Monumental Task of Restoring Houston After Harvey,” published in September.

Arendt was recently appointed to serve as secretary-treasurer of the Earthquake Engineering Research Institute. The EERI, located in Oakland, Calif., is the premier organization of professionals committed to earthquake safety around the globe. Arendt, a member of the organization’s board of directors, is the lead trainer for its Housner Fellows Program, which trains and leads professionals who address earthquake safety issues around the world.

Arendt presented a paper on Nepal’s building code compliance at the World Conference

on Earthquake Engineering in Santiago, Chile, in January 2017. She was the lead author on a scholarly article on Nepal’s building code compliance that will appear later this year in “Earthquake Spectra,” a premier journal on earthquake and disaster response and recovery.

Libraries

MBA student **Tyler Clark** will lead a service trip in mid-November to Veracruz, Mexico, where the team will build the community’s first library. Some 20 volunteers, including **Mitchell Lipke ’19**, **Aidan Collins ’20** and **Erin Weiler ’20**, of the St. Norbert Spanish Club, will build the 625-square-foot library, laying brick and constructing the roof, and will stock the library with desks, books and computers. Volunteers

will also spend time with local children, teaching them the importance of reading.

This will be Clark’s second service trip to Mexico. Readers of @St. Norbert (May 2016) may remember that he and his wife, Rebekah, raised \$3,800 to stock a library in Atexcac, Mexico, with 400 books, as well as computers and audio-visual equipment.

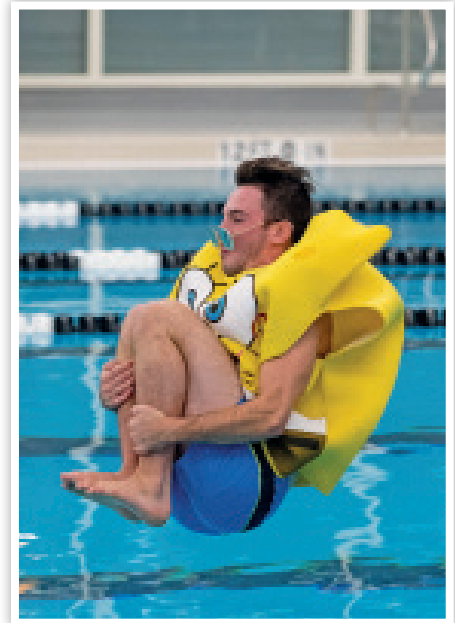
Classics

Let me leave you with these thoughts ...

My entire life has been organized around semesters. Always. Even when I took a year off before grad school, I taught English in Madrid. (Yep, there were semesters.) Every 15-week cycle brings new people, books, stories, conversations. Teaching offers adrenalin rushes, anxiety attacks and, at times, tedium. (Grading is occasionally rewarding, often humbling, and occasionally mind-numbing). But it is rarely repetitive.

Now, for the first time, I'll be leaving school – “graduating.” You have to understand that I've been teaching at St. Norbert College since 1984. That's 66 semesters. Talk about an institutional memory. When I arrived, Tom Manion was president, Dick Rankin was dean of students, Bob Horn was academic dean. Bob Vander Burt, chair of the humanities and fine arts, hired me. Brian Bruess was still in high school.

After all of these years, good years, I'm leaving. Making a list of impending losses is, I have discovered, not good for one's spirit. I'll miss the students, of course – their energy, their potential, their youth. I'll miss the faculty. I'll miss the fact that I can just leave my office, knock on a door, and have an inspiring, informative and often provocative conversation with a bright, highly educated person. I'll miss the very nature of the academy – the fact that whether I'm wondering about the diminishing nutritional value of crops, the impact of Brexit on France's economy, the scaffolding of writing assignments, or Constantine's spirituality, thoughtful responses are just down the hall. I'll even miss our common grumbling about Boyle Hall's décor, and parking.

Being at my core a reader, thinker and talker, my upcoming retirement and the endings that it represents have led to deep conversations, hours of self-reflection and obsessive literary consults. Literary? Well that's an overstatement. Not finding what I'm looking for in García Márquez or Roberto Bolaño, and loathe to embrace Machado's gloom, I've stooped to taking advice from people like Brad Pitt (great interview in *GQ*) and random columns about life change and the value of learning how to play tennis in the *Huff Post*. A better choice, it occurs to me, would be to turn to my St. Norbert models, of which there are many, since John Neary and I are the last ones standing among our cohort. But these models offer

radically different advice. Stay deeply involved in the college (Bob Boyer). Make a clean break (Bob Vander Burt). Move away! (Jim Benton). Back to examining my own particular needs, wishes and regrets.

What I have found is this. Retiring *is* much like graduating. I'm nervous about the goodbyes, but I know there's a *next*, a good and rewarding *next*; I'm just not sure exactly what it is. I am determined that this *next* will be more flexible than the *now*; that it will offer me a freedom to be and do and go when a book or place or person calls, not to subordinate all things and all loved ones to my teaching schedule. I have a lot of books to read, and one, at least, to write. It's been years since I've been in Spain when ripe Claudia plums flood the market, and I want to see them piled high and smell them and taste them again. But even more than this, I'm looking forward to retracing my own contours, revisiting my own wants and purpose. I'm fond of telling my students that I love planning my classes because I can choose which books to teach (my favorite books), which films to show (my favorite films), and which assignments to require (the ones that I most want to read). Over the past few years, I've been able to add that I even get to choose where we'll travel (Spain). But the truth is that good teaching is not about the teacher, it's about the ability of the teacher to read and respond to her students. The students should always be the focus: their stories, their progress, and their growth. After years of putting them first, I feel an odd affinity with the Boyle Hall steps: still serving after all these years, but worn and shaped by countless students.

Now I get to reestablish me. Not redefine, but reestablish. The more I've thought about who I am, what I love, and what I want to do, the more I realize that what I need isn't to reinvent, but to return, to give myself the space to simply let myself be. So lately I'm thinking of retirement as a summer evening after a successful day at work. I'll have time to ride my horse before I take a shower and pour a glass of wine. I'll start the aromatics and slice and salt an eggplant while I talk to one of my kids on the phone. I'll think about how to tell Steve we're going to Spain for a month in September (“Tickets are already bought, baby”). Then I'll curl up and read the new Kate Atkinson.

CROSS FIT

At first glance, hockey and golf appear to have little in common. One is a fast-paced, physical team sport played on ice; the other a leisurely, non-contact, individual sport best enjoyed on a warm day. But **Luke Karakas '19** (above) proves that some skill sets do cross over.

"The ability to transfer your weight comes into play in both sports," explains the two-sport Green Knight. "Creating torque is the biggest thing. Clearing your hips and getting your arms through on a puck or a golf ball is what makes that object go. I'm a longer hitter in golf, but I wouldn't be if I didn't play hockey."

Hockey legacy lives on

Luke Karakas '19 has played hockey most of his life, a good portion of it on teams coached by his father, **Kipp Karakas '88**. The younger Karakas is thoroughly enjoying his time on a St. Norbert College men's hockey team that features his dad as an assistant coach. Luke plays right wing while Kipp coaches the goaltenders – a position Kipp himself once held in club sport days at St. Norbert.

"I grew up playing for him since I was 4 years old," Luke says. "I had a lot of fun playing for him, don't get me wrong, but there were a lot of funny stories that came out of him getting mad. One time, he broke a stick on a post and then hit it again to make a point. Luckily, I was on the other end of the ice so he didn't see me laugh."

Kipp is the first to admit he was hard on his son while serving as head coach of Luke's youth teams and then his Green Bay United high school team. The combination of high expectations for his son and a desire to avoid showing favoritism, channeled through Kipp's competitive spirit, was a recipe for what Luke refers to as "a lot of red face" for his dad. "I was probably way too hard on him. I know I was," Kipp admits. "It got better as he got older and I got wiser. Over the years, our relationship has developed into a friendship. I'm his biggest fan, but I'm his biggest critic."

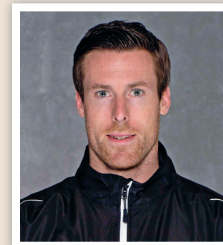
Luke's post-high school hockey career took a typically circuitous route across North America's junior hockey ranks before he landed a spot on the University of Wisconsin-Superior's roster for his freshman season of eligibility. He found himself the odd man out on an overloaded roster his sophomore season, and at his father's suggestion, Luke called **Coach Tim Coghlin** to inquire about a roster spot.

"I liked the kid because of his high character and he worked really hard to get where he was," Coghlin says. "Clearly in our minds, we felt he could compete at this level and we offered him a spot. He ended up earning two pretty significant awards last year: Hit Man of the Year and Most Improved Player."

Luke, who also plays golf for the college, is completing his final year of NCAA eligibility this season. "Now that I'm here at St. Norbert, [my dad] is one of my favorite coaches because he's able to keep it light. He doesn't feel the pressure of being the head coach."

"I really don't have much interaction with him at the rink," Kipp adds. "I have some input on playing time during coaches' meetings, but I'm cognizant of when they talk about Luke and I don't say a word."

Coaching coup



Out of the tightly knit collegiate hockey coaching fraternity, former University of Wisconsin star **Andy Brandt** joins St. Norbert College as associate coach for a Green Knights squad that has advanced to the Frozen Four 11 times since 1997 – including four Division III national championships.

Brandt, a member of the Badgers' 2007 Division I national championship team, played professionally for the Atlanta Gladiators (the Boston Bruins' East Coast League affiliate) and served as that franchise's coach and general manager for the past two seasons prior to coming to St. Norbert.

Coach Tim Coghlin says, "Andy is a very professional young man who understands the game at the highest level. He has been a champion everywhere he's been. We've been very fortunate with our coaches here over the years."



Tim Flood
Professor of Geology

We collected this sample of banded iron formation (BIF) from the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. It's 2 billion years old. This is the rock that is the evidence for the first oxygen in our atmosphere. Algal bacteria began giving off oxygen that bonded with free iron in the ocean, like rust, and settled to the seabed. Then this sample got deformed into a nice fold. Now, almost all the world's steel is produced from BIF. It's a fabulous tool for teaching about earth history.

The red is hematite. The shiny black is magnetite. Then, some of the real bright red is jasper. Even though I've been studying rocks for 40 years, I still say, some of them are just doggone beautiful.

When we went on a field trip this fall, to the tip of the UP, we drove an hour out of our way so students could collect their own samples. They make fabulous Christmas presents. When students give them away, it gives them a chance to say, "And by the way, let me tell you about this. This rock is 2 billion years old and, when it formed"

Tim Flood joined the faculty in 1987. His research interests focus on the geochemical processes that lead to the formation of continental crust, and on the teaching of geology.



Shared journey draws the faithful

The gathering was much more than a conference, says **Betty Anne Kenney**: “It was a reunion of friends and an opportunity to meet new friends, a time to be with like-minded people who have all elected to be on the same journey.” Kenney, an associate of Daylesford Abbey, was at the National Gathering of Norbertine Associates hosted at St. Norbert in July.

These “like-minded people” share a spiritual road-map. To become a Norbertine associate, a candidate must go through rigorous preparation that includes spiritual formation, communal discernment, study and sustained ministry. An associate, once approved, then takes vows committing him or herself to living according to Norbertine values as a part of their abbey’s community.

To **Nancy Jakups**, an associate of St. Norbert Abbey and organizer of the conference, those vows affirmed her desire to commit herself to a life of prayer and service in community. “Gathering in person centers around sharing,” she says.

The gathering at St. Norbert College made space for associates from the four Norbertine abbeys in the United States to share stories of how their mutual tradition influences their daily lives. Associates – a “third-order” vocation – came from St. Norbert Abbey in De Pere; Daylesford Abbey in Paoli, Pa.; St. Michaels Abbey in Orange County, Calif.; and Santa Maria de la Vid Abbey in Albuquerque, N.M.

Throughout their stay, Betty Anne and her husband, **Frank Kenney**, also an associate of Daylesford, grew in their appreciation of how the Norbertine mission and heritage has woven its way into the college culture. “The message is everywhere on campus,” says Frank, “with the

centrality, yet simplicity, of the chapel; on the walls of the buildings; the banners along the walkways; the statues; and, of course, the proximity to the founding community, St. Norbert Abbey.”

The Kenneys began exploring the vocation of associate after taking a Norbertine heritage pilgrimage in Europe with the **Rev. Andrew Ciferni ‘64**. The Kenneys realized their connection with the Norbertines was more profound than just participation in weekly liturgy at Daylesford Abbey. They began to pursue a closer affiliation. At the time, however, the abbey had no formal opportunities for lay persons to take vows. Ciferni introduced them to the idea of an associate program and they worked with Daylesford to begin one there.

As associates, the Kenneys, in addition to their day-to-day schedules and responsibilities, pray the Liturgy of the Hours daily – often at the abbey, but usually on their own at home: “This practice is a constant reminder that we are in communion with Norbertines throughout the world.”

The conference at St. Norbert was an opportunity for the associates, for a few days, to share their mutual observances of *communio*, contemplation and prayer. **Ken Griesemer**, an associate from Santa Maria de la Vid Abbey, says: “The subject of this meeting – how to respond as a person of faith to the call to care for our common home – was very timely. I came away from the gathering with a deep sense of hope in, and renewed commitment to, the collective efforts of many people of faith to make the planet a better place for all of us to live – especially those on the margins, those living in poverty and without hope.”

A Norbertine associate is a lay person, single or married, who makes a vowed commitment to live life in the manner of the Norbertines. (“Third-order” associates like theirs are sometimes known as oblates.)

One who desires to become an associate must enter a formation process that often takes several years before solemn promise is taken. The formation process includes discernment with the abbey community; study of St. Norbert, the Rule of St. Augustine, *communio*, hospitality, and more; ministry at the abbey and in the abbey’s community; and commitment to spiritual development including regular attendance at the abbey’s Liturgy of the Hours, Mass, and other ceremonial liturgical events.

Associates do not live at an abbey nor are they necessarily working full time within the community’s particular ministries; yet they are fully members of the community in which they take vows.

Room for the family



Sensenbrenner Hall Room 110 has been home to more than 100 students since the hall was built in 1956. This year brought about a connection not likely shared by any other inhabitants of the room: **Sara Allaire '21** moved into the same room her mother, **Beth (Pankratz) Allaire '91**, had 30 years ago – and it was all coincidental!

As the two were talking among several family members at a family reunion this past July and the subject turned to college, they asked where the young Allaire would be living. She had just found out and looked it up on her phone. She would be in Sensenbrenner 110, she shared.

“My cousin [**Lauren Danning '14**] went to St. Norbert and she graduated a few years ago, and she was in Sensenbrenner 127,” Sara says. “And then my mom was like, ‘oh, I think I was in Sensenbrenner 120 or something.’” That was the first that Sara learned her mother had also roomed in Sensenbrenner – quite the coincidence, and, they thought, how funny it would be if they’d had the same room.

“So [my mother] texted her freshman-year roommate, who she’s still really good friends with ... and said ‘do you know what room we were in freshman year?’” says Sara. “And her roommate was like ‘yeah, we were in 110’ and she sent a picture of their dorm room.” The

photo of their room included the room number, and Sara could barely believe it. “I checked it again ... because I thought, ‘wait, is this right?’ It was all random and it was all just ... luck, I guess.”

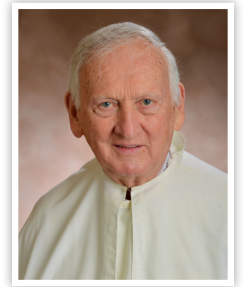
Moving Sara into her room proved to be a trip down memory lane for her mother. “She was talking about she remembered this and this, how the drawers are really, really big and the closets, and how the floor is the same, how everything is still how she remembers it,” says Sara. “It’s funny that 30 years later, it’s literally the same thing. It’s all good, I love it!”

“My mom and my dad [**Tim Allaire '93**] both went here, and they met here, right outside the cafeteria. My dad was really pushing for me to go here and my mom was like ‘go wherever you want to go.’ It was my decision 100 percent, but they were very happy that I went here. They really love this school and they have a lot of ties; we have a bunch of family members who went here.”

Sara’s father’s siblings all attended St. Norbert themselves, as well as a great uncle, a cousin and another aunt. “It’s fun to carry on the legacy. I’m also majoring in education which is exactly what my mom and dad majored in.” Her parents had loved St. Norbert, “with everyone welcoming and loving and caring for everyone, and they knew that was just perfect for me.”

THE REV. GERY G. MEEHAN 1934-2017

The college community says farewell to the **Rev. Gery G. Meehan '57**, who died Aug. 23 at the age of 83. Meehan entered St. Norbert Abbey and was vested as a novice in 1952. He professed simple vows in 1954 and solemn vows in 1957, when he also received a bachelor’s degree in philosophy from St. Norbert College. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1960.



Meehan taught at Abbot Pennings High School for 19 years, and then served as principal of the school for 11 years. He earned a master’s degree in French from Middlebury College in Vermont, and then spent two years as a French and German instructor at St. Norbert. Meehan was then named pastor of St. Norbert College Parish at Old St. Joseph Church and director of campus ministry, serving from 1993 to 2001. While pastor of the campus parish, Meehan oversaw the renovation of Old St. Joe’s. Following his ministry at St. Norbert College, Meehan ministered at St. Willebrord Parish in Green Bay and at local nursing homes.

The **Rev. Mike Brennan '99**, remembers Meehan as “one of the most humble and kind and quirky men that I ever met.” He says Meehan was known for his sympathy and understanding, and notes how Meehan could always be counted on when someone was in need. “He just did what we’re all called to do ... and he did it as a gentleman can and should,” Brennan says. “He knew what it meant to be a postulate in the sense that, if you went to him, he sat and listened.”

Julie Massey (Mission & Student Affairs) says, “Father Gery showed me the value of bringing varied gifts and voices around the table,” adding that Meehan was “great in humility, brimming with wisdom, and always oriented toward service.”

Meehan is survived by the Norbertine community of St. Norbert Abbey and by two brothers, James and Jack.

KHALID FATTAH '20 1995-2017

St. Norbert College remembers **Khalid Fattah '20**, who died July 18 at the age of 22. Fattah was pursuing a degree in the sciences and finished his first year of studies in May. An international student from Saudi Arabia, Fattah had an on-campus student worker position in the Center for Global Engagement. **Jana Dettlaff** (International Integrated Studies) remembers Fattah as “very gentle, polite, respectful, considerate, caring and immensely thoughtful.” **Susan Ashley** (English as an Additional Language) says, “The hole he has left on this campus cannot be filled by anyone else.”

Fattah is survived by his mother and brother.

HEEDING THE CALL



A charge to amplify the stories of others started the eighth president on his journey home to St. Norbert.

His whole vocation journey has been informed by his experience as a student, says **President Brian Bruess '90**. And it was a student experience that was driven by his undergraduate years at the very institution over which he now presides.

It's a calling learned, heard and responded to in the context of higher education, and its foundation, like its latest expression, is rooted in the tripartite mission of St. Norbert College.

"The education that I received here has everything to do with how I am as a person and therefore as a president," says Bruess. "I have a deep, deep regard and respect for the liberal arts, Catholic, Norbertine education, coupled with the belief that the way we do this here is different, unique and distinctive.

"It's much more complex missional and educational work than at a secular institution, even than at a religious institution that has two parts to its mission. The power of our mission is not that we're Catholic, or that we're liberal arts or that we're Norbertine. The power, true transformational power about what St. Norbert College does, is the integration of those three dimensions. It's like a beautiful Venn diagram of three circles all held together. Each of the pieces of our identity brings forth more depth – and more meaning for students."

It's one thing to say you're a liberal arts college, explains Bruess – an institution that pursues knowledge, truth, wisdom, for the betterment of society. It's another thing to say that you use the Catholic tradition to frame the conversation between faith and reason; use Catholic social teaching to frame your thinking about human dignity and to underpin your work for the common good. And it's another if, in doing so, you espouse the Norbertine charisms of preparing for good work, of the value of *communio*: "Each of those three things, independent of another, is pretty powerful. Entire colleges and universities are built on two of them. The opportunity we have at St. Norbert, and the gift we have for American education and the world, is that it's all three."

These three emphases are meant to interact and create dissonance – to create opportunity for learning and new ways of seeing the world, says Bruess: "I think that's what gives our mission such power, such breadth, such meaning."

The nature of Bruess' work as an administrator in higher education, as a faculty member, and now as a president has been very much informed by his experience as a student. In fact, he says, his entire vocational journey has been built on this framework. His graduate education focused on how students grow and learn: what theoretical constructs give light or definition to how they grow or develop; how they develop cognitive capacities like moral reasoning and critical thinking; how they develop skills like judgement and leadership:

"And then, how do they develop the psycho-social elements of themselves. And that would be things like their sense of self, interpersonal relationships, their care for their physical self, their spiritual self, these other dimensions. The psychology, sociology and liberal arts training I have gotten all have this confluence. And of course, this is all done in the context of our education, which is built around this very simple premise of pursuing knowledge, truth, wisdom, for the common good.

"So, there's an alignment and a rhythm to my education at St. Norbert, how that manifests itself in my professional life, which brings us [Bruess and his wife, **Carol (Sessler) '90**] back."

The biggest challenge the college faces today is society's lack of understanding of what a liberal arts education offers, says Bruess. "People hear liberal arts education and they think liberal. They think bleeding heart. They think a leftist ideology. But really the liberal arts [tradition] is based on an idea and a premise of how we see the world, how we learn, how we know. The core requirements give us breadth across the disciplines, and [our chosen major in one discipline] gives us depth and a capacity to think deeply on a particular subject. And just those acts of working down and across disciplines – looking at a range of how these disciplines interact; at what art teaches us, what truth and beauty, and what philosophy and theology teach us about the intersection of faith and reason – that back and forth, that way of interacting and learning, we think is significantly meaningful in how students grow and develop."

At this early stage in his presidency, Bruess owns to having far more questions than answers: "What's distinctive about St. Norbert College? Why are we doing so well? What makes the experience for students so impactful?"

"Let's build from there. We're in a position of strength, so let's operate from that perspective.

"The belief that everybody has worth: That's very Catholic, it's very Norbertine. Frankly, if you dig in a little bit, it's very much about the liberal arts. It's the practice of looking for that goodness, and that worth and that beauty in what we're doing. There's something really inspiring and compelling about that. As a college, how do we amplify the best of what we're doing here and pursue that next level of expression of our vision? How do we take the best of what we're doing and make it more visible?"

How do we advance and make our mission more relevant by amplifying what we do best? And, of course, the way I think we need to do that is to focus on the teaching and learning and student experience."



The next new chapter for a college begins with the naming of a new president, and the presidency starts to feel real when the new leader gives his first opening-of-the-year address to faculty and staff. Bruess used the occasion to hark back to 1987, when the young future president walked into Boyle 103 for a class in the Society, Sex and Marriage course taught by the late **Tom Faese** (Sociology): "This particular day, Tom was teaching about how relationships become, evolve and flourish. He balanced intellectual rigor with accessible emotional intelligence, and a clear passion for teaching. As he so often did, he captured the imagination of each of the 40 students in that room. He taught us the importance of ever striving for a more full understanding of truth, our world, and relationships. And he proceeded to ask us a bunch of questions. What if we were expressly and persistently highly attentive to the other – really working hard to learn what the other was thinking, and feeling? What if our essential purpose, in all relationships, was to, for each and every day, and each and every person, put our focus and attention on amplifying the other? If we did this, faithfully, in a loving way, might we find the fullest way of human flourishing?"

"So whatever role you play – be it coach, advisor, front-line staff person, a chef, groundskeeper, a counselor, a painter, a professor – each and every one of us has the opportunity to make a meaningful difference to our students, and each one of us contributes. And so, tell stories of when you were transformed, or significantly impacted, as a student. Tell about a time when you experienced the power of reflection, or learned the clarity of thought that can come from careful analysis, or the creative instruction of words. When did you experience a culture different from your own, and what did that teach you? When did you last experience the emotional power of a play or a musical performance? And when is the last time art changed how you felt or thought? Teach and learn with the intention of amplifying each other, and tell that story."

It's very Catholic, very Norbertine, says Bruess. It's very much what infuses a liberal arts education. It's the challenge for the wider community of St. Norbert College. ✚

The programs for both Mass and installation ceremony bore the words of Henry David Thoreau, “Only that day dawns to which we are awake.”

President Brian J. Bruess '90 formally took the helm in a ceremony laden with tradition. The new president stands in a succession that began with the unprecedented 57-year reign of the college's founder, Abbot Bernard Pennings, and continues into the new millennium. food for thought

Student researchers are playing key roles in one grad's creative effort to provide urban residents with improved access to healthy food

At first glance, Green Bay would seem to be immune from the sort of healthy food-access issues more commonly found in bigger cities. Major grocery retailers are plentiful around the perimeter of the city, but therein lies the challenge: Residents of inner-city neighborhoods exist in what has become a food desert, where unhealthy, processed foods are often the only available choices.

An aggressive initiative by NeighborWorks Green Bay, a nonprofit organization focused on sustainable community development, aims to improve that situation by developing an urban farm – what it is calling a Farmory – in a long-vacant

former armory building on the city's east side. A series of St. Norbert College connections is helping move the effort toward fruition.

Twice the benefits

NeighborWorks Green Bay, which primarily focuses on housing renovations in older neighborhoods, bought office space in 2002 at 437 S. Jackson St. and a nearby former armory building at 815 Chicago St. Its initial plans to convert the armory into condominiums never materialized, and the building sat unused until the urban farm idea took root.

closed-loop system

The Farmory now houses an aquaponics system that combines yellow perch production with a year-round vertical farming operation. The system eventually will be capable of producing 173,000 pounds of mixed greens per year. The closed-loop system uses fish waste as fertilizer for composting operations and 95 percent of the water used is recycled via pumps after filtering through the plants.

“We currently have one aquaponics system, but we envision as many as 50 systems down the road,” says **Alex Smith '15**, Farmory program director for NeighborWorks. “When we started doing community outreach a year ago, most people didn’t know who we are. Now, more people know about us and we are in the middle of a \$3.4 million fundraising campaign.” The multitiered aquaponics system uses gravity to run waste-filled water through the natural growth cycles of lettuce, spinach and other greens. The system fertilizes the plants while cleaning the water for reuse in the fish tank. The long-term goal is to have a storefront for local residents as well as supply agreements with area restaurants for the perch and greens. The Cannery Public Market in the Broadway District is one early customer.

Raising yellow perch populations for Friday-night fish fries at area restaurants is another potential revenue stream for the operation. Perch hatchlings are difficult to obtain and tricky to raise. The Farmory is working with the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee fish-science program to build a sustainable fish hatchery. The Farmory has successfully progressed from two trial families of 130 fish apiece to a maxed-out population of 600 fish in its 700-gallon tank.

Student research makes the case

NeighborWorks Green Bay was early in its fundraising stage during the fall of 2016 when it tapped St. Norbert College for assistance in conducting an economic impact study that would help build the case for donors. **Marc Schaffer** (Economics) and **Jade Rohloff '17** set to work compiling evidence to show how important the Farmory would be for local communities from an economic perspective.

A subsequent brainstorming session

led Smith to suggest the St. Norbert team take a look at food insecurity in the Farmory’s neighborhood. According to the United States Department of Agriculture, food insecurity refers to reduced access to quality, variety or desirability of diet. Hunger is a condition that may result from food insecurity.

“The key word there is ‘access.’ People who live there may only have access to unhealthy, processed foods,” Schaffer explains. “Food insecurity tends to be focused on lower-income demographics. It also brings about obesity issues, which are common in low-income areas.”

Schaffer, who directs the college’s Center for Business & Economic Analysis (CBEA), assigned the project to **Alexa Brill '18**, a research analyst with the center. The CBEA serves as a link between the Donald J. Schneider School of Business & Economics and the local business community, providing students an opportunity to hone their skills with real-world application.

Brill looked at the food insecurity issue through two essential lenses: What is food insecurity in general? And, what’s happening regionally and within the Brown County area? Her research revealed a shortage of healthy food access within walking distance of the Farmory and low average spending on produce by area residents.

“Alexa did all the work,” Schaffer says. “She made the case that the Farmory lies in an area that experiences higher instances of food insecurity.”

NeighborWorks is using Brill’s work as the basis for personal fundraising efforts to supplement grant requests and crowdfunding initiatives. The success of the Farmory’s yellow perch and mixed-greens production efforts are the organization’s most effective sales pitch. The fact that the Farmory building itself happens to sit in the middle of such an at-risk area is a bonus.

“This research report allows us to back up everything we’ve been hearing from the community,” Smith says. “Alexa put it in a very visual and concise way so when we put together a package for potential donors, they can see how important food insecurity in the Green Bay area really is.” ✚



One for the ages

Boyle Hall celebrates its centenary

It is the indentations in the Boyle Hall steps that move **Dave Klopotek '64** (Chemistry, Emeritus). "I always felt I had to step in those, to follow in the footsteps of all those who went before me." Every St. Norbert alum still living once took classes within its walls, and many studious generations to come will enter between its pillars. This semester marks 100 years since Boyle Hall first opened its doors to undergraduates hungry for learning. And, for a good part of the building's history, there were high school students, too.

Those three steep flights of broad steps were not the only route to the top, although they were probably the surest. **Ken Zahorski** (English, Emeritus) recalls that, in the early years, the elevator was notoriously unpredictable, and was always getting stuck in between the floors. "Ed Hruska in Communications would take it nearly all the time. I can see his head, and I could see he was chewing gum – because that was all you could see. He was chewing his gum and waiting. I don't know how many times he had to be rescued from that elevator."

The interplay between a building and its occupants takes shape over the years. The building had its eccentricities, remembers **Bob Boyer** (English, Emeritus). When the space was divided up to create more faculty offices, the majority of those were inner rooms, partitioned with spaces at the top and bottom of the walls: "I had to get something from Jim Benton's office one Saturday – and I could get into the complex, but your doors could lock which, of course, was



kind of ridiculous. I ended up climbing over the top of the partition and getting the paper I needed, and then making my escape." It's a story that put **Eliot Elfner** (Business Administration, Emeritus) in mind of what he terms the beauty of Boyle Hall, back in the day: "We had multiple disciplines next to one another. You just got an office where you were. We didn't group by disciplines as we do now." Ahead of the 1984-85 renovation, **Mural Adams** (Education, Emeritus) was in charge of moving those professors out of Boyle into "other nooks and crannies. The dean said he gave me \$2,000 [for this role] primarily to keep all those people out of his hair. I didn't get into a quarrel with anybody!"

That renovation would bring with it a welcome new amenity: air conditioning. "You can't imagine how hot the two upper floors got in mid-summer," says Zahorski. "You were just always hoping that someone with a window office would open a window. A great deal of smoking went on, both on the part of faculty and students. Every desk, you would have an empty tuna or salmon can for an ashtray. Sometimes you would look at your class through a smoky haze."

On occasion, the local paper mill would contribute its own notes to the special Boyle Hall atmosphere. "When I asked about the smell I was told that was the smell of employment," recalls **Karina O'Malley** (Sociology, Emeritus).

Henry Boyle himself would have agreed. No stranger to industry himself, he was, in fact, a prominent yeast manufacturer who, with his wife, **Julia**, funded the building's construction in gratitude for the fine education received by their son, **Francis H. Boyle**, Class of 1916, (after whom the edifice is named).

"Saturday morning classes were dreadful. We were like the walking dead. We had an 8 a.m. theology class with a Hungarian Norbertine. He used to stand on his desk and talk to the Holy Spirit in his hand." – Donald Taylor '67 (Galleries, Emeritus)



From 1932 to 1959, St. Norbert High School occupied the upper stories of Boyle Hall. In the dormitories, it was lights out at 10 p.m. – although a lot of students had flashlights so they could keep studying under their blankets.



"I'd walk into the building and have to instantly take my winter clothes off because it was super hot just walking in the building. I've always called it 'Boiling Boyle.'" – Tasha Dantoin '20



“Nov. 22, 1963, I was studying in Boyle Hall library when a student came up to me and said President Kennedy was shot. We gathered in the basement of the Union and watched the CBS news. Quiet, crowded, and all shocked.” – Sue Vine '66




“Father Keefe presided over his Boyle Hall botany lab sitting at a desk on a raised dais, high enough that he could survey all us working diligently on botany projects. Lab time began when Father Keefe struck the brass gong he had obtained while serving as a chaplain in the Pacific during World War II (with enough off-duty time, apparently, to discover a new species of mosquito, named in his honor – *aedes keefe*). The sound of the gong was quite effective in quieting any chatter in the large room.” – Jack Williamsen '60



The original two-story study hall was transformed into a banquet hall in 1934 to celebrate the 800th anniversary of the death of Norbert of Xanten, and again in 1936 to celebrate the Golden Jubilee of the ordination of Abbot Bernard Pennings.

The new Boyle Hall, dedicated on Aug. 19, 1917, housed 13 classrooms, a bookstore, cloakroom, six dormitories, living quarters for supervisors and a large two-story study hall and convocation center on the high-ceilinged third floor.

Leading edge

Since 1976, more than 5,000 women in higher education have further developed their leadership ability at an elite summer institute. Following this year's program, two St. Norbert women talk over the HERS experience.

Last summer, Karlyn Crowley (English) and Tynisha Meidl (Education) joined 66 other women at Bryn Mawr College for the HERS Leadership Institute, a two-week immersion course that prepares women faculty members and administrators for leadership roles. Acceptance to the highly competitive program brought with it the chance to introduce St. Norbert College women to HERS – the Higher Education Resource Services program – and a year of preparation focusing on institutional awareness, networking and self-knowledge.

CROWLEY: I feel like people are always going to ask, “Why should a women-only leadership program exist?” In higher education, you can look at the data and we know that, statistically, seeing women at the deans’ and presidents’ levels is still really low. And as people talked about at HERS, we’re about to have a mass exodus at the dean and president level of men, especially, who are retiring. So, the next generation of leadership of higher ed is being shaped right now. HERS reaffirms the degree to which it’s still so critical because so many women still don’t see themselves as leaders in a really deep way. HERS tries to reframe that.

MEIDL: It’s interesting because, unless you know what HERS is and you look at what each of the letters stand for, you would not assume – it would be misleading, right?

It would be misleading in the sense that you would not assume that it has

focused and has been structured for the past 40 years on developing the next generation, or the next cohort, of leaders in higher ed, particularly deans, directors, chairs, provosts and presidents. They’ve been doing this work for a long time.

CROWLEY: It started in ’73, which is early, and at Bryn Mawr. So intentionally having it at a women’s college is really powerful, visually and experientially – to see the campus as a space, as a kind of incubator or lab for women’s leadership. And it’s considered the premier institute for women in higher ed. It’s all the parts.

MEIDL: Yes!

CROWLEY: It’s not just women’s leadership, it’s not just higher ed and co-ed; it’s women’s leadership in higher ed, specifically.

HERS has this amazing number of alumnae who have now gone on to be deans and presidents. There’s something really specific about that women’s-only environment and space – to be self-reflexive about gender and other forms of identity and leadership – that’s different from other kinds of leadership programs, many of which may be a week or less. And we both have little people in our lives. You can imagine what it has meant historically for women to – for two weeks – live in a dorm and think about their leadership.

MEIDL: And I would say, if we think about HERS not just as this two-week residential experience, but about what

actually happens in the two weeks, there are three major components: career development, individual leadership and institutional awareness.

In terms of career development, HERS challenges participants to think about where they are now, what they value, what is next – and what is after that, and what is after that, and potentially after that. It’s about having structures in place that facilitate that thought process.

Coming out of HERS, I recognized that that was really one of the first times that I thought about, not just about where I wanted to be, but what are all the other pieces that inform where I want to be, professionally, and what are the implications of those decisions?

CROWLEY: And we were able to get honest, frank feedback from others about those decisions. Part of what happens when you spend two weeks in a dorm, talking about leadership for 12 to 14 hours a day, is you don’t have time to partake in the sort of social niceties – and you’re urged not to – that are a necessity of a long-term community of people you live with or work with day-in, day-out.

HERS creates the environment for women to practice a really critical leadership skill to learn, which is not hedging your speech, having more frank discussions, challenging people to see themselves as more than they think they are. That happened in groups again and again, when someone would say, “I think I’m going to go home, and I think I’m going to propose X,” or, “I think I’m ready for Y.” A lot of people around the table would look at their CV, would look to them, and say, “no, I think you’re aiming too low.” I don’t know if enough of us – no, I’m confident not enough of us – have people in our lives to say, “you’re aiming too low.”

MEIDL: So what’s the next piece?

CROWLEY: Individual.

MEIDL: Yes, your own individual leadership profile. Who are you as a leader? How does your personality inform

your decision-making process? How does that inform how you go about your work? How does that inform your relationships, how you build them, or maybe how you don't build them? In other words, coalition building, or this notion of team, and what that means in terms of helping to fill gaps in a leadership style or to complement your leadership.

And after spending two weeks discussing leadership and focusing on my own leadership profile, I have much more confidence in my own leadership.

CROWLEY: I agree. I have a renewed sense around my own intuition as a leader and also what in gender studies we call agency – the movement between a thought and the ability to act on and complete or fulfill the thought. A high sense of agency means you have a lot of confidence to be able to follow through, and I left HERS with a greater sense of agency. That's what I long for, think or hope for, for myself and the college. I have a much greater sense of confidence that it can be done.

But HERS isn't all about the individual. While some people might perceive attending a leadership program as a self-centered move – that it's all about the self, we're improving one's own leadership – the focus of the institute is as much, if not more, on bringing back what you know to your institution and thinking with the system's mindset about your institution.

MEIDL: Exactly. Another main component of HERS was on institutional awareness: really understanding the landscape of higher education, everything from student affairs to the business and finance and auxiliary side, to legal counsel, to legal affairs, to the academic piece, and diversity and inclusion and equity. So really providing a big, broad brush stroke of the key facets of what make institutions of higher ed work.

CROWLEY: And I think something that's particular to HERS that's a little different from other leadership programs is that we had a lot of pre-homework to think about a leadership project that we

would do at HERS and then bring back to our own campuses.

MEIDL: That was part of our application.

CROWLEY: Exactly, that was part of the application. It's a competitive application, and not all leadership programs are. So even before we started, we were thinking about a leadership project, and now we're continuing those projects here.

HERS also allows us to bring St. Norbert into this incredible network of women leaders. We send leaders to HERS, who then get to hone and focus and work on their leadership profiles, and then they also get this incredible networking cohort for the rest of their lives. That's why some schools send and have sent women leaders year after year, because they're not only interested in helping their own people develop leadership skills wherever they go, whether it's the institution or somewhere else, but they want to have access to a really exciting pool of women leaders who are interested in their own improvement. St. Norbert really benefits by basically this beautiful cycle of having people go and bring back information to the institution.

MEIDL: And we really hope we can continue the cycle. It's so important more women from St. Norbert get involved.

I have an analogy. Think of a road: There are lots of layers in a road. Before a road can be made, there's a bunch of trees in the way. We just knocked down those trees. Now we need more women to go, to be that foundation, to be the gravel, to be the asphalt, and eventually to be the lines on the road. All the while, we're building that road to increased women's leadership at St. Norbert. ✚



Student days under Pennings

Sixty years later, alumni from the St. Norbert College class of 1957 still laugh when recalling how they celebrated the birthday of the college's founder. They remember gathering in the priory each year on June 9 with all the other students to sing "Happy Birthday" to the abbot – following with a "free day, free day" chant, asking for a day off from classes. Former Homecoming queen **Sue (Nelson) Antonello '57** remembers the founder saying, "You can have a free day anytime." Still, he made sure to honor the tradition of the free day on his birthday. "He'd give it to us," says **John Rath '57**, who says he spent the day playing sheephead with classmates. **John Bayer '57** chuckles when he admits, "We'd all go to the taverns."

Abbot Bernard Pennings, a priest of Berne Abbey in the Netherlands, had landed in the United States in 1893 along with two Norbertine confreres. The three men were embarking on missions for the order in northeast Wisconsin. Pennings would preside over the college from its founding until 1955. He saw 1,652 students graduate from St. Norbert College while he was at the helm, says **Chris Betcher** (Alumni Relations), who coordinated the reunion.

About 15 of Pennings' own students, alumni of the class of 1957, attended their 60-year reunion back on campus in August. They reminisced about the food

served to them in the dining hall, how they hitchhiked to and from classes, and what it was like knowing they were in the presence of the founder of St. Norbert College. It was a special moment when Pennings was spotted on St. Norbert College grounds, always wearing his white Norbertine habit, says **Thomas Kiedinger '57**. "I was excited to see him whenever he was walking on campus," Kiedinger says. "It was nice to know he started the college."

Pennings spent less time at St. Norbert College during the later years of his tenure, but students still felt his presence. "He was low-key as far as the students were concerned, but he knew what was going on," Rath says. "He was very quiet, very devout. Just his presence commanded respect." His affection for his students was evident, according to Rath.

Pennings established the first Norbertine foundation in the United States at the National Shrine of St. Joseph in De Pere in September 1898. He was named the first abbot of De Pere in 1925, after St. Norbert Priory was raised to the status of abbey. He died March 17, 1955.

"He had an aura about him," Rath says. "You could tell he was a man of God. ... He could ask you to do anything in the name of God, and you'd do it. And he wouldn't tell you; he'd ask you."

Legacy of learning beside the Fox

"How often his Norbertine confreres observed him peering through his binoculars toward the Fox River and out toward the Ledge, the hilly elevations that lead north toward 'Baie Verte,' Green Bay, the body of water that lines the shore of Door-Kewaunee Peninsula, where the founder of the college had labored among the Belgian immigrants for five years (1893-1898) before coming to De Pere. He loved the view of the Fox River, the birds, the boats, the barges, the lake-like scenery. Even into his 90s, Pennings often remarked, 'The best thing we ever did was the founding of St. Norbert College.'"

Michelle Akane Sugimoto Storey always wanted to change the world, and now she's doing just that, one birth at a time. Storey is clinical director and midwife at Luna Maya Birth Center in Chiapas, Mexico.

Labor Day After a couple years volunteering in Mexico, I became pregnant. I immediately knew I wanted to stay and have a midwife birth. I checked out Luna Maya and fell in love with the care. I ended up having a home birth myself. It was one of the most beautiful, most powerful experiences of my life.

Nursing hopes I moved to Minnesota and was working in a Latina domestic-violence organization. I realized how many women have horrific birth experiences, often because they're given misleading information. So, I moved back to Mexico to begin my own midwifery training.

Birth rate We have one to six births per month. I once had 12, but that was crazy! We do most births in the women's homes. It really makes a difference to the flow of labor when a woman is in her own setting.

Call the midwife It's hard to do something simple like going out for pizza with my family, because I'm always on call. A lot of times, it's sit down and order, then, "Oh! Pack mine up to go, please!"

Labor of love In Mexico, midwifery is sometimes looked down upon. Many people assume we're old, decrepit women with no formal training or education. But I'm able to meet so many incredible women and accompany them in the most beautiful, magical moments of their lives. That's incredibly rewarding to me.

For as much success as **Bart Wolf '94** is having with his Motorsports Villas development, his true passion remains with race cars. The Wolf Motorsports teams prepare as many as 10 cars on race weekends at Road America.

A shop that serviced three customers two decades ago now services 17, with some cars worth upwards of \$2 million. In addition to mechanical expertise, the Wolf Motorsports team performs custom fabrication and machining, at times making parts that haven't been made in 40 years.

"Some of our guys helped me out when I was racing. It's like getting the band back together," Wolf says. "I trust each one of them to prepare these cars well. I would jump in any of these cars and feel confident."



Race car biz picks up speed

The first order of business for **Bart Wolf '94** upon earning his business degree from St. Norbert College was buying a race car. That might not typically seem like the most appropriate use of funds for someone fresh out of college, but it makes perfect sense for someone with racing roots as deep as his.

Growing up near Road America, the world-famous road course in Elkhart Lake, Wis., Wolf caught the racing bug at age 7 on the go-kart circuit and watched his father do some racing as well. His grandfather even did some of the excavating work when Road America was built in the 1950s. Wolf has raced cars at various levels for 37 years, and his Wolf Motorsports shop caters to others with the same passion. Now Wolf has taken his interest in all things car-related to a level never before seen in Wisconsin with the development of Motorsport Villas of Elkhart Lake. The private condominium community caters to car enthusiasts and racers who, as Wolf puts it, "have a car habit they're trying to house."

"I had heard about these communities in Naperville (Ill.) and Minneapolis, and I started to think there might be an opportunity here," Wolf says. "I talked to customers at my shop who live in other states, and they were excited about it. I had commitments before we even had drawings up."

Wolf acquired some property near the

track and made plans to construct eight buildings with 32 customizable residence units. He figured a realistic goal for selling out the available units would be three or four years, maybe quicker if things went well. That timetable hit the accelerator when the local newspaper, the Sheboygan Press, did a story on the project that was picked up by USA Weekend. Activity snowballed from there. "Sales were happening so fast, and people were worried about missing out, that we sold out in four and a half months," Wolf says. "It blew my mind."

Wolf expected about 65 percent of the units would have interiors completed this summer, with the rest not far behind. Many of the owners live in warmer states during the winter, while some are Elkhart Lake residents already. Their high-end hobby features collector cars as well as active race cars.

A significant business benefit for Wolf lies in the captive customer base he has for his expanded Wolf Motorsports shop, which sits on the south end of the development. The new shop is five times larger than the previous facility and is already full. The shop focuses primarily on race-car preparation, with some restoration capability.

After the dust settles, Wolf sees his property becoming a motorsports arena for meetings, weddings and other events for "car-crazy people."

Sweet wheels



When **Bart Wolf '94** and his crew talked about finding the ultimate vintage race car to bring to their shop, the late Chicago Bears star Walter Payton's Sports 2000 class racer rose to the top of the list. However, Sweetness' car had dropped out of sight and finding it proved a challenge.

Fortunately, an ad in a Florida publication looked promising and a check of the chassis number confirmed its identity. The car had been painted a different color, but Wolf and his partner were able to confirm its authenticity and bought it.

"It's a neat piece of racing history," Wolf says. "Walter had raced at Road America with this car."

Wolf and his team were able to acquire uniforms from the early 1990s and wore them for the popular car show in downtown Elkhart Lake prior to the vintage car race at the track.

"We won best in class at the show," he says. "It was a lot of fun."



Driven to help Alzheimer's patients

Through more than three decades in the restaurant business, **Karl Van Roy**



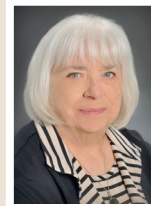
'61 earned a reputation for good service that is matched only by his service to his country, state and community.

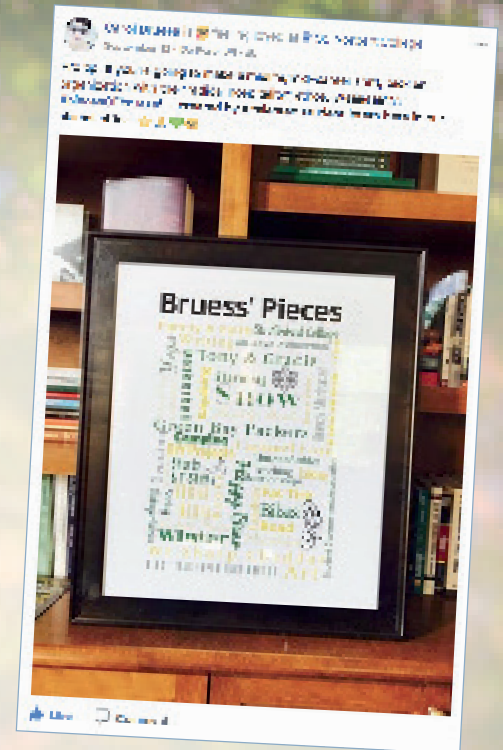

It's a curious thing for a new president to report on the financial year (2016-17) that concluded before he had moved into the office assigned to him. Yet, reviewing the accomplishments of that year made me feel proud as a supporter of President Tom Kunkel's and as an alumnus of this great college. By September 2015, having learned of President Kunkel's pending retirement, I was also and already diving deeply into the college's needs and aspirations as I thought about drafting an application for the job. Truth to say, those needs and aspirations had never been far from my and Carol's minds. As proud alums, the concerns of this college have been our concerns since we first set foot on the campus, just as its mission has helped form our own.

On December 2, 2016, I was humbled to learn that my next role in higher education would be to lead this fine institution. Over the next six months I had the great privilege of working closely with Tom as he mentored me, briefed me, drew me into decision-making, and brought me to the table with key stakeholders. We had a thoroughgoing weekly phone meeting, and at least once a month, I was able to spend a few days on campus. I couldn't imagine a better period of preparation and induction and, as Tom's farewell drew near, my feelings were all of gratitude, friendship and undying respect.

It was an exciting time on campus, too, with the completion and dedication of the Mulva Family Fitness & Sports Center – a top-notch facility that includes the college's first swimming pool. To the long list of generous donors who made this project possible – a list headed, of course, by Jim and Miriam (Brozyna) Mulva '69 – we were thrilled to be able to add the names of Larry '68 and Kathy Gentine whose \$1 million gift named the new Wellness Center, and former college trustee Jim Kress, whose \$1.5 million gift aptly named the Jim Kress Gymnasium "Jim's Gym"! Our students were able to try out

the facilities before they left for the summer, and the first Commencement in the facility followed shortly afterward. Over the summer, as I settled into my own new office, it was a fine thing to watch our coaches move into their finely reimagined building after a year of disruption – a year in which, nonetheless, the Green Knights matched the school record for most conference titles in one year.

I was learning fast myself and all the while keeping tabs on the academic front, too. Across campus, in January, the first cohort entered our new Center for Exceptional Leadership; in March, our new Doctor of Pharmacy partnership with the Medical College of Wisconsin was announced; and, in May, the first graduates from our burgeoning MBA program would collect their diplomas.

The faculty approved the new Gateway Seminar that introduces first-year students to the history and mission of the college while equipping them with the skills and understanding they need to succeed as members of our college community. Then, thanks to the erudition of Tom Kunkel and Father Andrew Ciferni (with a big helping hand from ITS), the college offered the whole world the chance to learn more through its first MOOC (massive open online course) on "St. Norbert: The Man, the Movement, the MOOC."

Our own campus continues to draw experts from around the world, as it did in summer 2016 when the college played host to the well-received 2016 ASACCU Conference for student affairs professionals from 44 Catholic colleges and universities. Then, during the fall semester that followed, it was our pleasure to host the college's first-ever semester-long visiting distinguished scholar, Harry Brod. We would later share in the sense of loss of the academic community when Harry, a founding scholar in the field of masculinities, died this summer. But we were touched beyond measure when, in his obituary notice, his family suggested memorial donations to the

But it's one that flourishes uniquely in the living learning environment of our residential campus. 2016-17 brought us the chance to offer new living options as the first students moved into the renovated priory building. Riverside and Vander Zanden, both halls well past their sell-by dates, were taken down – opening the way for exciting plans to extend the shrine of St. Mary into a new riverside Grotto of Our Lady and the Kunkel Meditation Garden named to honor Tom and Deb. 2016-17 saw the reinvigoration of the college of chaplains: A group of Norbertines once again share responsibility for sacramental leadership of the college parish. And the staffs of our former Campus Ministry and Faith, Learning & Vocation programs have come together to create the new Emmaus Center

for Spiritual Life & Vocation.

All this would be for nothing were it not for our intentional efforts to attract a talented and diverse student body. We would welcome another group of gifted, driven and engaged first-year students this fall. The Class of 2021 arrived in De Pere as one of the highest academically profiled and most ethnically diverse classes in our history. 
